Precious pendant

Exposed bulbs were one of the hot trends Mark Moussa of Arteriors discovered while traveling in Europe and India to design his 2013 collection. Now the bulb you choose is as important as the shade. The most popular are filament bulbs, which harken to the early days of electricity, but others range from silver tipped round bulbs to tubular bulbs. Pictured is the Edmond Brass/Glass Hexagon Pendant with an antique brass finish and clear glass. It is 22 inches high and 16 inches wide and has a suggested retail price of \$1,170. Art deco drama

Schonbek's Cappela table lamp may look like the perfect fit for a South Florida art deco design, but it was actually inspired by ornate antique Venetian mirrors that have been popular the past few years. Its scrollwork is mirrored on both sides and decorated with floral motifs. A jet black crystal sphere supports the 21-inch high lamp with a graceful shade. 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Bakehouse beauty

Fine Art Lamps, with a corporate office in Miami Lakes, has a reputation for producing lamps that appeal to high-end design. The company's glass department has developed a bakehouse for crystal, a new concept in art glass lighting. They use a five-day process to create crystal spires, crystal river stones and crystal colored shades by hand. The glass is

baked for several days at high temperatures to produce a large block, which is polished. Bubbles and seeds form naturally. They

are available in four different looks -Crystal River Stones, Crystal Spires, Crystal Shards Blue in aqua and cobalt and Crystal Shards Natural in carnelian

and citrine. The Vol de Cristal chandelier has sweeps of tapered beveled crystals set in metal
